



**Madhya Pradesh Homoeopathic
and Biochemic Practitioners
Regulations, 1966 (DHB)**

No. 1679-V-SR.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (d), (g) and (h) of sub-section (2) of section 62 of the Madhya Pradesh Excise Act, 1915 (II of 1915), the State Government hereby makes the following further amendment in the Foreign liquor Rules, published under this Department Notification No. 14-V-SR., dated the 7th January, 1960 namely:—

Amendment

In the said Rules, to rule IV, the following explanation shall be added, namely:—

“Explanation—Where the fee per bottle system is introduced for the licenses in respect of which it was not applicable before, the fee shall be recovered on the balance of stocks in accordance with the scale of fees per bottle fixed by the Government.”

No. 511-DHB-66.—In pursuance of the provisions under clause (d), (e) (f), (g), (h) and (i) of sub-section (1) of section 29 of the Madhya Pradesh Homoeopathic and Biochemic Practitioners Act 1951 (XXVI of 1951) and in supersession of previous regulations made on this subject and with the previous sanction of the State Government vide Public Health Department, Government of Madhya Pradesh memo No. 158-8865-XVII-M-IV, dated the 6th January 1966, the Board hereby makes the following regulations, namely:—

REGULATION

1. These regulations may be called the Madhya Pradesh Homoeopathic and Biochemic Practitioners Regulations, 1966.

2. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) “The Act” means the M. P. Homoeopathic and Biochemic Practitioners Act, 1951 (XXVI of 1951);

(b) “Examinations” means Examinations conducted for the diploma in Homoeopathy and Biochemistry (Part I and Final);

(c) “Registrar” means the Registrar of the Examination.

(d) “Superintendent” means the Superintendent of the Examinations.

3. (A) The following subjects will be taught in the course :—

First Year Students

- (1) Organics and Inorganic Chemistry.
- (2) Anatomy and Physiology.
- (3) Principles of Homoeopathy, Biochemistry and Dietetics.
- (4) Simple clinical methods and first aid.
- (5) Materia Medica (30 Homoeopathic and 12 Biochemic Medicines).

Second Year Students

- (6) Knowledge of diseases and Pathology, Diagnosis of Surgical diseases.
- (7) Therapeutics, Prophylaxis, Personal Hygiene and Public Hygiene.
- (8) Medical Jurisprudence, Antipathic and Heteropathic Treatment.
- (9) Materia Medica (34 Homoeopathic Medicines)
- (10) Gynaecology and Midwifery (short of surgery).
- (11) Practicals.

(B) This course of training shall be finished in two years.

(C) The language of training for this course and of holding examinations shall be Hindi or English.

✓(D) Males and Females above 16 years of age on 1st July of the year of admission and holding a certificate of having passed the Matriculation or equivalent examination shall qualify for admission to this course.

4. The examinations for the diploma in Homoeopathy and Biochemistry shall be held at Bhopal and at such other places as may be fixed by the Board for the purpose. It shall be held under the direct superintendence of the President or under superintendence of such persons as may be appointed by him in this behalf.

5. The examination shall begin on such date as the Board may fix. The dates, programme and places of examinations shall be widely notified atleast three months before commencement of the examination.

6. The following shall be eligible to appear to the Examination :

- (a) A student who has undergone a course of training in an Institution established or recognised by the Board and is recommended by the Head of the Institutions.
- (b) A Homoeopathic and Biochemic Practitioner whose name is entered in the list maintained under section 18 of the Act.

7. Every student who is admitted in an Institution established or recognised by the Board must be enrolled with the Board. The enrolment fee shall be Rs 3 per candidate and every enrolled student will be issued an enrolment card bearing his enrolment number which will invariably be mentioned in the application form for admission to the examination. No student who is not so enrolled shall be permitted to appear in the examination as a regular candidate from any Institution.

8. (i) Every application for admission to the Examination shall be in the form appended to these regulations and shall reach the Registrar atleast eight weeks before the commencement of the examination. The application shall be accompanied by a fee of Rs. 24 (Rs. 20 Examination Fee and Rs. 4 Marksheet)

for the Part I Examination and Rs. 20 Examination Fee and Rs. 4 mark-sheet) for the final examination. A candidate who fails to pass or present himself for the Examination shall not be entitled to refund of the fee except the candidates who take ill at the time of examination. In such cases, half of the examination fee will be carried over for the next examination.

(ii) The fee shall be collected by the Board on or before the date fixed by the Board in this behalf. In case the application is received within the next fortnight from the date above fixed a late fee of Rs. 5 (Rupees five only) will be charged.

9. Candidates who have failed in two subjects securing atleast 25% marks shall be eligible for the supplementary examination, which will be held at least 15 months after the declaration of the results. Fees for the supplementary examinations will be Rs. 24 Rs. 20 for Examination and Rs. 4 for marksheet for the examinations. If the candidate fails in supplementary examination also, the shall be deemed to have failed in all subjects, and shall have to appear in all subjects in the next year. For failures, the fees for next year will also be the same as for regular candidates.

10. The examination will be held in the following subjects. The marks which each paper carried and which an examinee must obtain to pass the examination are shown against the respective papers:—

11. The time allowed for each paper shall be 3 hours.

12. The Text Books will consist of such books as the Board may prescribe from time to time.

13. In order to pass the examination an examinee must obtain in each paper and in the practical the minimum marks prescribed in regulation 10 and in the aggregate not less than 45 % of the total marks.

14. As soon as possible when the examinations are over the Board shall widely notify the list of successful examinees and the names of examinees obtaining the first ten positions in order of merit.

15. Each successful examinee in the examinations shall receive a Diploma in Homoeopathy and Biochemistry (D. H. B.) in the form prescribed by the Board

16. The re-totalling of marks shall be permitted on payment of a fee of Rs. 10.

17. The Examiners for the Practical Examinations and for the papers III, V, VII, IX, XI, Gynaecology and Midwifery shall be appointed by the Board from amongst the staff of recognised Institutions or practitioners Registered under section 16 of the Act. The Examiners for the rest of the papers shall be appointed by the Board from amongst Degree holders or Diploma holders in Allopathic Medicines.

18. The Registrar of the Board or any other person appointed by the Board shall be the Examination Officer and his duties be the following :—

- (1) To get the question paper moderated by the President and the Examiner if and when necessary.
- (2) To maintain due secrecy in everything that is necessary for the conduct of the examination till the results are notified.
- (3) To do everything that is necessary for the conduct of the examination.

19. The Superintendent shall make seating arrangements for the candidates, distribute the question papers, blank answer books and writing material and collect the answer books and send them to the Registrar in properly sealed packets. He shall be paid such expenses and remuneration as may be fixed by the Board.

20. The question papers will be sent to the Superintendent of the Examination Centres concerned by the Board's Office in properly sealed cover. The sealed cover containing the question paper will be opened before 10 minutes of the commencement of the examination and the sealed cover will be initialled and

dated within time by the Superintendent and Head of Homoeopathic Institution who will not be a member of the staff of the Institution concerned.

21. The examiners and invigilators shall get such remuneration as may be fixed by the Board. The Examiners shall set the question papers, moderate them in consultation with the President, Examine the answer books and send them back to the Registrar after they are examined along with the result in sealed cover.

22. The results received from the examiners shall be placed before the Special Committee of the Board appointed for the purpose. The results approved by the Special Committee shall be declared.
